


Big Picture

We saw that Chiang Rai province has had at least 243 residential care facilities and 47 have closed





Chiang Rai as **6265** children while Chiang Mai has **3780** children



Observations







Founded or operated by religious personnel such as monks, pastors, or clergy


Using religious teachings to teach morality for children

Observed religious symbols





Education is an important factor making children enter residential care and is still a main reason that organizations open residential care facilities



Saw a problem than more children do not have registered identification than Chiang Mai



There are at least 6 Islamic affiliated residential care facilities

(but none were identified in Chiang Mai)
